Topic/Agenda	Discussion	Action/Follow-up
Welcome and Introductions	Ms. Reena Rambharat, Director of the Howard County Local Health Improvement Coalition (HCLHIC) of the Howard County Health Department (HCHD), called the meeting to order at 9:00am. Ms. Rambharat welcomed members and guests and reviewed the goal of the meeting to present updates from Johns Hopkins Howard County Medical Center (JHHCMC) and Workgroup activities in support of the Healthy Beginnings, Healthy Living and Healthy Minds priorities. 	Dr. Maura Rossman, Health Officer of Howard County, and co-chair of HCLHIC, gave gratitude to staff for their hard work and mentioned the effort towards growing seedlings for community members to create more vegetable gardens in the county.	
Johns Hopkins Howard County Medical Center (JHHCMC) Updates	Ms. Rambharat introduced Dr. Shafeeq Ahmed, President of JHHCMC, to provide updates from the Medical Center. Dr. Ahmed, shared updates regarding post-COVID challenges, as well as things that were going on pre-COVID and things going on currently: • Emergency department capacity ○ In Maryland alone, over the past year, there's been a 40% reduction in number of beds. ○ Staffed-bed issues from changes in staffing due to pandemic and general hesitation with working in healthcare. ○ Inpatient behavioral health unit in the hospital constantly full. ○ Effective capacity of the emergency department to see patients begins to shrink	

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when you have Medical Boarders and psychiatric boarders.

- Challenges with wait time are ongoing
 - Emergency department sees about 76,000 pediatric and adult patients per year.
 - Behavioral health issues have changed and evolved over time increasing number of emergency department visits and longer stays.
- Plans for future
 - Behavioral health unit to be expanded from 6 space unit to 24 space unit
 - Hospital to create an additional 29 bed observation unit within hospital

Ms. Rambharat inquired how the HCLHIC can help the Medical Center. Dr. Ahmed suggested continuing to partner on programs that avoid hospitalization. Further, he mentioned providing resources that keep patients from being readmitted. Ms. Rambharat inquired how many patients are readmissions. Dr. Ahmed shared that the percentage hovers between 10-13%.

Ms. Rambharat inquired if the behavioral health unit expansion will include pediatrics. Dr. Ahmed mentioned that it will not include pediatrics as there is a separate behavioral health unit within the pediatric emergency department.

Dr. Katrina Fowlkes inquired if it was possible to use the Medical Arts Building as space for more acute patients. Dr. Ahmed shared that the observation unit expansion would accomplish this as it may not be feasible to use the Medical Art Building for that space.

Ms. Octavia Brown, inquired about the hospital patient demographics, the resources in the hospital available to people of color or people who have marginalized identities, as well as what organizations that are a part of the HCLHIC

can do on a policy level to aid in making those resources available. Dr. Ahmed shared that the demographic makeup of the hospital's population is relative to the county. Further, Dr. Ahmed mentioned that the staff population reflects the county's population as well. He also mentioned that the hospital has community health workers addressing other issues that are unique to patients.

Ms. Genny LaPorte, inquired what behavioral health staff will do after the expansion of the behavioral health unit. Dr. Ahmed shared that the staff would continue their tasks but will be moved from their current placement in the emergency department.

Ms. Janet Jones inquired if there was a hospital coalition that works with the skilled nursing facilities and home health agencies to discuss admissions and readmissions and how to work together to help. Dr. Ahmed shared that the hospital does have a connection with them, but they are also facing capacity challenges similar to the hospital.

Ms. Rambharat mentioned that Howard County data shows that the area is lacking primary care. She inquired as to why there's a shortage of primary in care in the county. Dr. Ahmed suggested that the as a primary care provider, the number of patients one may take may not be listed. A switch from primary care to concierge medicine may decrease number of patients that can stay on a provider's panel. So effectively, a provider may be there, but they may not be taking care of as many patients. Ms. Rambharat inquired if virtual primary care options were helping. Dr. Ahmed mentioned that again capacity limits how many visits a physicians can see either virtually or physically.

It was inquired what are the plans and is there a role for community health workers to help with finding some of those unmet needs and maybe decreasing that kind of burden. Dr. Ahmed shared that there would not be an expansion but there would be an optimization of the community health worker role.

Dr. Katrina Fowlkes inquired how her nonprofit can partner with the hospital to offset some of the expenses the hospital incurs. Dr. Ahmed mentioned connecting with Matt

- Howard County Public School System announced the free summer meal program that will run weekdays June 24th to August 2nd.
- Received seeds from ACE Hardware Store and grew them into seedlings for the older residents living in the Owen Brown Place.

Ms. Samantha Cribbs, Howard County Health Department, provided updates for the Growing Healthy Families Workgroup. Growing Healthy Families updates included:

- Black Maternal Health Week event's focus this year is on restoring Joy through Community Care.

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Ms. Jessica Fisher, Howard County Health Department, provided updates for the Healthy Minds and Suicide Prevention Coalition (HMSPC). HMSPC updates included:

- January Meeting had a presentation on Safe Messaging from Jessica LaFave
- HMSPC Action Plan has been updated to include tracking partners efforts in providing HoCo residents mental health and suicide prevention support.
- Group working on developing a Safe Home brochure/infographic that plainly informs Howard County Residents on how to create a safe home environment (safe storage of medications, fall prevention tips, safe storage of firearms, etc.).

Ms. Natalie Hall, Howard County Health Department, provided updates for the Movement Group. Movement Group updates included:

- March meeting had a data presentation on Falls from HCHD Epidemiologist and there was discussion on potential education outreach plans based on the data.
- Recurring small group discussion will be held to plan falls prevention efforts covering various levels of influence from the Social Ecological Model and involving various partners including the Health Department teams, hospital, Office on Aging and Independence, and Fire and Rescue.
