	Ms. Fisher led an engaging discussion on self-care practices with our members. Participants generously shared their individual approaches to maintaining mental well-being. Key takeaways from the conversation highlighted the significance of rest, spending time in nature, and participating in activities like gym workouts, meditation, and gardening. The discussion	

	also emphasized the importance of community support and personal reflection, with several individuals stressing the benefit of focusing on what we can directly influence in our lives.

	 Ms. Fisher gave an overview of the March 20, 2024, meeting which focused on the emotional challenges due to the recent job losses and current administrative actions: Participants voiced significant worries about the rising number of individuals facing job loss. 	

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	 Maribet Rivera-Brute, LHIC Director, discussed the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) timeline (Phase I, II, and III), acknowledged the information gained from the Root Cause Analysis and Health Main Drivers, and acknowledged the selected solutions from the Healthy Minds Roundtable meetings held on January 30th and February 25th. Ms. Stephanie Foster, LHIC Community Engagement Coordinator, presented the possible goals that will be included in the LHIC 2026-2028 Action Plan, and asked the Coalition members for feedback and actions steps to be added to the FY26-28 Action Plan.

	Key feedback highlighted from the Community Health Forums held in March included:	
	 Community members expressed a strong interest in having more engagement opportunities. There is a noted need for increased resource sharing among our community partners. The community voiced a desire 	
	for greater collaboration and improved communication regarding available services.	

Discussion/Brainstorming with Coalition Members Regarding Community Engagement	Ms. Fisher highlighted the community's feedback from the Community Health Forums. Key concerns included a need for increased community engagement opportunities and awareness of available resources and the value of developing stronger partnerships with current organizations. 	The group also discussed the accessibility of Mental Health First Aid training, with participants suggesting more flexible methods for sharing information and delivering the training. Time and cost	Effective Community-Level Strategies to Prevent Gun Violence Webinar (Video)
	were noted as significant barriers to the current training format, and there was support for Community Health Workers to lead more accessible programs. 	Coalition members voiced concerns about participation barriers in Mental Health First Aid training, specifically the amount of pre-work and the full-day commitment. They proposed exploring alternative approaches to ensure community members can still obtain essential mental health knowledge. Other members shared their experiences and suggested better coordination among trained individuals to offer more adaptable training options. 	The group recognized the value of engaging community leaders to help facilitate mental health training and resource sharing. A multi-tiered approach to mental health support was also proposed, suggesting broad public messaging alongside targeted training for specific groups. The importance of providing timely resources and improving communication about available training opportunities was also noted.	
	Additional topics discussed included the importance of conducting a community asset analysis to gain a clear understanding of existing initiatives and promote better collaboration within the	

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	suicide prevention coalition. The group acknowledged that Community Health Workers are already actively identifying resources in specific areas of Howard County, which will help ensure our coalition's efforts are well-focused and avoid duplication. We will continue this discussion at the July
